



ON FRIDAY, AUGUST 14, our destination will be the newly opened THE CUTTAWAY AT BARANGAROO. This is Sydney's newest entertainment precinct in a unique underground concrete and sandstone space below the parkland and near the waterfront at Barangaroo.

Leaving Leumeah station at 8.29am (Macarthur 8.23) in carriage 3, we will travel to Circular Quay and catch the 9.42am ferry to Barangaroo from Wharf 5 (Pyrmont Bay Ferry route F4). Once at Barangaroo we can have morning tea at The Canteen, then proceed to The Cuttaway. I am hopeful that we can walk right into this building as it only opened for performances this month. Along the walk past Waterman's Cove, we can view the five new floating sculptures 'Monuments for Fishes' by Australian artist Mikala Dwyer. The sculptures are inspired by the rhythm of the sea, the ecology of Sydney Harbour and Barangaroo's rich fishing heritage. From there, we will make our way to The Rocks area down through the Argyle Cut and into The Rocks Markets. Lunch can be found in many places in this area or near Circular Quay. You may choose to bring your own packed lunch. Hope you can join us.
